She received her MA from Webster University (MO), MSN from Northern Kentucky University, and Ph.D. from California Coast University. Her areas of focus include infection control, immunization, international health and travel, vaccine research, refugee health, and global health.

"The addition of Dr. Ruth Carrico as a keynote will take this conference to the next level. Her session addresses the concerns that so many in this field face," said Therese Long, OSAP executive director. "It's time to open the dialogue and actively communicate how these issues impact the future of dental care."
