During his distinguished career, Dr. Jaffe led the first national case-control study to discover the risk factors for the emerging AIDS disease. For more than 20 years, he held leadership positions in the Central for Disease Control's HIV/AIDS program and served as director of the National Center for HIV, STD and TB Prevention. His work was depicted in the Emmy Award winning film, And The Band Played On.

Dr. Jaffe serves as a Friend of OSAP, member of the Institute of Medicine of The National Academies, the Infectious Diseases Society of America and has been a fellow of the UK Faculty of Public Health. His interests are focused on HIV/AIDS and global health research.

The annual OSAP symposium is a must-attend conference for those in the oral healthcare field. The theme of the 2013 event, which takes place June 13-15 in San Diego, is Charting a Course for Infection Prevention & Safety. Hosted at the Hyatt Regency Mission Bay Spa & Marina, the
