Dr. Bergman, a 1974 graduate of the Witwatersrand Medical School in South Africa, has served as Treasurer of the Board of Directors of Medical Education for South African Blacks, which provided scholarships to train black healthcare professionals in South Africa. She specialized in

Internal Medicine and Pulmonary Disease at SUNY Downstate (Brooklyn) and Stony Brook and practiced Pulmonary Medicine and Critical Care in Patchogue, N.Y. She also served a term as Medical Staff President of Brookhaven Memorial Hospital Medical Center and as its Medical Director of Respiratory Care Services.
